

TYCO WATER – MAKING A DIFFERENCE

In mid-December, Ismi Nasip, President Director of Tyco Water Indonesia and Dedi Saptadi, Technical Support Supervisor travelled to several remote Kupang village communities in support of the first Clean Water Access Initiative water project. Following initial deliveries of the more than 60 kilometres of donated Tyco Water pipes and fittings, the pair conducted training workshops in pipe jointing, water system installation and maintenance.

This training enabled the communities and Action Against Hunger | ACF International, our Clean Water Access Initiative partner, to begin construction on 4 water supply systems that will ultimately improve access to safe water for 40,000 people across 13 communities.

“Once they have the new water systems in their villages, these people will no longer have to walk long distances through the hills to get clean water,” says Ismi. “This will have a significant positive impact on their lives.”

The Kupang communities were extremely thankful, not only for our donated products, but for our commitment to train the pipeline installers. In the end, it is the correct installation of quality pipes and fittings that will make the difference for a sustainable water system solution.

“This project means a lot to me,” says Ismi. “I have now personally seen the conditions in these villages and understand how much effort the villagers put into getting water. We’re really proud to make this kind of contribution to help others.”
